



BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CRIMINOLOGY DEGREE PROGRAM

This degree offers a practical theory-based interdisciplinary education that stresses human behavior, social and cultural dynamics, communication and leadership. The criminology curriculum addresses crime analysis, law enforcement, public safety and security, the criminal justice system, regulatory agencies and social support that work toward the improvement and transformation of society. Students have the option in their senior year to take graduate-level courses toward a Master of Science in Criminology degree.
