Additional Placement Information:

The Stout Street Clinic is one of a number of clinical sites run by the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless. The organization functions as an advocacy group developing affordable housing for

the homeless in addition to providing a myriad of other health related services including psychiatric/psychotherapy, medical, dental, optical, and an auxiliary pharmacy. There are physicians, psychiatrists, and LCSW's on site. Interns expect to be trained on the Strengths Model of therapy, a teamwork approach geared towards assisting clients develop personal empowerment. Additionally, interns may be exposed to peer group supervision.

Internship requirements: Attend Thursday morning staff meetings on the 1st, 2nd and 4th Thursdays from 9 – 11 am. Other meetings should be attended on days the intern is at the site.

All trainings available to staff are available to interns.

Interns must be registered with the State in the Registered Psychotherapists Database.

A process recording is required at least once a month. Interns are trained in HMIS. Sessions are entered in HMIS.
