COURSE INFORMATION

The mission of the Health Information Management Program is to promote excellence and leadership in health information management. The HIM Directed Practice is an important aspect of the students program insofar as they provide a means for classroom knowledge and practical experience to come together in a unique learning experience.

HIM 385 - Directed Practice (2 credit hours)

Course Description: An internship of 120 site hours following completion of the junior year. Provides an overview of health information services and hands-on experience with technical skills in an online environment designed to simulate the activities that would be completed in an HIM department setting.

Prerequisites: Completion of all lower division HIM courses (specifically HIM 313, 320, 350, 415 and 423).

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of the directed practice, the student should be able to:

- 1. Apply classroom knowledge in an actual health services setting
- 2. Describe various medical record/health information department services and functions
- 3. Perform specific medical record/health information department activities including, assembly, analysis, document imaging, coding and release of information.
- 4. Describe departmental policies and procedures and evaluate their effectiveness.
- 5. Explain the relationship of health records to the facility as a whole.
- 6. View medical record procedures from both technical and managerial standpoints.
- 7. Identify and complete a site survey of two health care organizations for the HIM485 Management Practicum.

ACTIVITIES FOR THE DIRECTED PRACTICE

The primary objective of the Directed Practice is to provide the student with hands-on experience in the day-to-day tasks and operations of a health records/information department. The Directed Practice is the first practicum course required in the HIM program for the students. Therefore, this training should have a technical focus. However, it is not feasible for a student to become technically proficient in all activities during such a brief time frame. The process should include:

- 1. Charting the flow of a record through the department or following electronic workflows
- 2. Determining interdepartmental and intra-departmental organizational relations, and
- 3. Discussing the technical operations of each section in conjunction with the overall management of the department.
- 4. Understanding how the HIM department is organized, fits into the overall facility structure and the functions of each area.
- 5. Understanding of how Information Technology, Admissions, Patient Accounting and other critical departments interface with the HIM department.
